The end of this month will find us in "full speed ahead" with participation in the Mane Event in Red Deer and our three clinics with Jerry Tindell of California. April 25 –27 is our first clinic with Jerry at the Lakedell Arena at Westrose AB. [west of Wetaskiwin]. Please take note that **all** of our clinics are open to **all equines!** This clinic will be geared to young stock or those than need retraining. It has always been fascinating to witness Jerry work with green or troubled animals and to watch their progression as he communicates with them in their language. For the benefit of us humans, Jerry clearly explains all along what is happening, why, and what needs to be done in order for the horse, mule or donkey to "make the change." Lots of "ah- ha" moments occur for the handlers and those auditing! Auditors are always welcome [\$30/day] and you will get your money's worth as Jerry always includes his auditors in all that is going on. All clinics start at 9:00 am each day and end around 4:00pm.
